



HDTV EXHIBIT AT WISCONSIN STATE FAIR

The Wisconsin Broadcasters Association and Sound Investments, Ltd., are co-sponsoring an HDTV exhibit at the Wisconsin State Fair in West Allis August 1-11. The exhibit is located in the Wisconsin Products Pavilion. The WBA has recruited help from Wisconsin TV stations' engineering staffs to represent DTV broadcasters and to answer questions from the public about HDTV in general.

Sound Investments, a Milwaukee-area company specializing in home theater, home automation and security, has six HDTV monitors on display, ranging from 15" to 57" and one SDTV projector.

A Samsung DTV-only receiver (\$599) feeds a 15" 4:3 LCD monitor (\$1,299), a 27" 4:3 Zenith CRT (\$999), and a 30" 16:9 CRT (\$1,599). An RCA DTC-100 feeds a third-generation Pioneer 43" plasma display (\$9,850), which seemed to gather the most attention. A 53" projection set also shows HDnet. Another 57" projection set is showing either WTMJ-DT or the output of a JVC HM-DH3000U D-VHS HDTV VCR. The 16:9 projection sets are in the \$3,500-4,000 price range. The JVC VCR, at \$1,500, features a Firewire input for HD recording, but can also record SD or analog video. The JVC-provided HD material playing on this VCR rivals the quality of HDnet or WTMJ's HD feed. (Pretty impressive for what looks like a VHS cassette!)

I volunteered for the first day of the fair, where maybe 200-300 people came through between 9 AM and 3:30 PM. The most frequent questions I heard from visitors were:

- *How much does this cost (referring to the plasma display)?*
- *Can I see the Packers in high definition?*

CHAIRMAN COMMENTS ON DTV PROGRESS

FCC Chairman Michael Powell issued two statements on the progress of DTV. In a statement issued on July 11th, he commended ABC, CBS, HBO, and Showtime for their commitments to broadcasting a "wide range of high definition programming". He also commended Discovery, HDNet, and PBS for their programming efforts. He noted that DBS suppliers were going to provide five channels of HDTV or value added programming by January 1st and NBC was planning on increasing its HDTV programming. Cable also was commended for its

adoption of new digital boxes capable of HDTV. Fox's plans for value-added digital were also noted.

The Chairman also posted copies of letters from heads of NAB, Disney ABC, Discovery, Viacom CBS, NBC, National Cable & Telecommunications Association (NTCA), HBO, News Corp-FOX TV, and the Satellite Broadcasting and Communications Association. In these letters, these groups noted their progress on the digital transition so far and gave their plans for the future.

In the July 11th statement and in a second statement on July 12th, the

Chairman stated that the commitment of the consumer electronics industry to the manufacturing of DTV tuners was in fact no commitment at all. He stated that the consumer electronics industry was waiting for certain issues to be resolved before acting, while others had moved forward. Powell did commend Zenith for their commitment to a phased-in DTV tuner requirement.

AMATEUR RADIO NEWS

- Sunspots keep growing and growing, and one wonders if the peak of solar cycle 23 has really passed. With sunspot numbers topping 300 this week, it appears to be an unusual third peak in a cycle with a double peak so far. The average solar cycle lasts 11 years. Cycle 23 peaked in 2000, then after a decrease in activity had a second peak in December 2001. Sunspot numbers recently surged back to peak again on July 27. Current helioseismic readings suggest several active regions on the sun's far side, so more excitement may be in store. Strong solar activity can occasionally cause problems with satellites and electrical power distribution.

- Bob Baird, W9NN, former engineering supervisor at WGN radio, died August 1 at age 96. Baird, of Plover, Wisconsin, was among the longest-licensed amateurs in the US, having been a ham for more than eight decades. "Bob was an icon, and he will be missed by many in Wisconsin and around the world," said American Radio Relay League Wisconsin Section Manager Don Michalski, W9IXG. Baird remained active on the air until shortly before his death. He reportedly died peacefully in his sleep with his niece, Betty Johnson, WD9AUC, at his side.

A native of Dayton, Ohio, Baird was first licensed as a youngster in 1920 as 8BTI. He later became 8CWR. He went on to become engineering supervisor for WGN in Chicago (where he acquired the call 9NN in 1927), retiring after 36 years of service. Baird was a founder and charter member of the Quarter Century Wireless Association. Last year, fellow QCWA Chapter 174 members presented him with a plaque honoring his years of service to QCWA and his long tenure as an Amateur Radio licensee.

- *When is analog TV going away?*
- *...and various questions on sports and prime time network shows available.*

There is still plenty of confusion in the public's mind over the role of HD on cable, over-the-air broadcasting in digital, satellite reception, and my favorite, whether a special ("HDTV")

antenna is needed to pick up the local digital stations. More than once when that question was asked, two of us simultaneously answered "No!"

I was pleased to hear the overall favorable answers that the gentlemen from Sound Investments gave in response to the questions about broadcasters.

Some people asked when local stations would begin broadcasting HDTV, and most were surprised when we answered that about half the stations in Wisconsin already were.

Nearly all visitors were awestruck as they entered the exhibit room. I felt that this year's exhibit generated more excitement and interest than last year.

The National Association of Broadcasters maintains a list of DTV stations that are in operation. This can be found at the NAB web site (www.nab.org) in the DTV update section.

As of August 7th, there are 455 DTV stations in 135 markets providing programming. Over 88% of all US homes are in markets with at least one DTV signal on the air. In Wisconsin there are 15 DTV stations currently on air, with the most recent being WAOW-DT in the Wausau market.

EchoStar Ka-band Licenses Cancelled

In July, The Federal Communications Commission revoked the licenses for two Ka-band orbital locations that had been granted to EchoStar Communications Corp in May 1997. The licenses for geosynchronous orbit satellites at 83° W.L. and 121° W.L. had authorized 500MHz of uplink and 500 MHz of downlink spectrum for two-way broadband data service for fixed satellite service. The Dish Network DBS service operated by EchoStar operates with Ku-band allocations, and is not believed to be directly affected by this FCC action.

The FCC states that EchoStar failed to satisfy the initial mandatory implementation milestone as set forth in the original license authorization. The milestone required EchoStar to begin construction of its Ka-band satellite system by January 2002. To determine whether the licensees had complied with the terms of the license, the FCC requested that each licensee submit an executed copy of a construction contract to verify that construction had begun on the spacecraft.

EchoStar had reported that it was working toward a launch later this year of the EchoStar IX satellite, which would include Ka-band capacity. The FCC requested and received documents from EchoStar that demonstrate that EchoStar has contracted to build a satellite that will operate in the C-band and Ku-band frequencies. The FCC contends that the contract does not assure that the Ka-band transponders will ever be operational.

Thirteen other applicants were granted licenses for Ka-band satellite systems in May of 1997. Of those, nine

had construction, launch, and operation milestone requirements included in their authorizations. In June the FCC released a public notice stating that six companies, including Hughes Network Systems, Loral CyberStar, and Teledesic LLC had met their construction commencement milestone requirements.

VisionStar, a company developing a Ka-band system and majority owned by EchoStar, has filed a request for an extension on the Ka-band license. Other licensees including Motorola and Astrolink have filed for extensions.

SPECTRUM FOUND FOR 3G WIRELESS PHONES

The National Telecommunications and Information Administration has recommended spectrum for use by third generation wireless phone systems. These are systems that will carry both voice and data at higher rates than is possible with existing wireless systems.

The NTIA has selected the bands of 1710-1770 MHz and 2110-2170 MHz for 3G wireless, and has set forth a plan for the re-allocation of the frequencies from 1710-1755 MHz and 2110-2170 MHz for this new service. Note that the upper band of this pair of frequencies starts just above the 2 GHz TV remote pick-up band.

The FCC released the notice on July 24, 2002 and asked for comment by August 8, 2002.

AUCTIONS POSTPONED

Congress passed and the President signed a law postponing auctions for the spectrum that is currently occupied by TV channels 52-69. The auction for spectrum in the 747-762 and 777-792 MHz bands that was scheduled for January 14, 2003 will be rescheduled for a later date. Congress gave the FCC the authority to set the new date with no deadline.

The Congress did set a date for the auction of spectrum in the channel 52-59 band. That auction will be for a paired band of frequencies of 710-716 and 740-746 MHz and a second band of 716-722 MHz. This auction will encompass one license for the paired frequencies in each of 734 market areas and one license in each of six regions of the country for the 716-722 MHz.

The six regions in total will cover the whole nation. The date for starting the auction will be August 27, 2002.

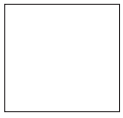

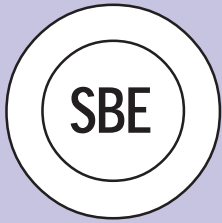
