The certification program developed by the Society of Broadcast Engineers continues to be an excellent way for broadcast engineers to exhibit knowledge in their field, both to their employers and their peers. It also helps provide motivation for individuals to continue to learn about technology used in the changing business of broadcasting. The next available opportunity to take a certification exam is November 8 – 18, with a deadline of September 29 to get your completed application to SBE National.

The National Certification committee has selected dates for upcoming certification exam opportunities. The dates for exams in 2003 have been set. The 2003 local exam dates are February 7 – 17, (application deadline is December 31, 2002), June 6 – 16 (application deadline is April 25), August 15 – 25 (application deadline is June 13) and November 7 – 17 (application deadline is September 26). The certification exams at the NAB convention will be given on April 8 (application deadline is March 1).

The 5<sup>th</sup> edition of the *Television Operators Handbook and Certification* has been released. This updated edition includes the latest information that all TV master control operators should know. As a companion to this, the Certification Committee, with the approval of the National Board of Directors, is working with an author to prepare a new version of the *Radio Operators Handbook and Certification*. The author is Ron Bartlebaugh, director of engineering of WKSU-FM, Kent, OH. The new edition will be available later this summer.

SBE certification and recertification helps you stay current with technology, and challenges broadcast engineers to expand their knowledge of the industry. ## June Business Meeting Minutes

Chapter 24 of the Society of Broadcast Engineers met on Thursday, June 20, 2002 at the studios of WKOW-TV in Madison, Wisconsin for the chapter's monthly meeting. There were 11 member members in attendance, 8 of whom were certified, and 3 guests.

The meeting was called to order at 6:26 PM by Chair Tom Smith. The May meeting minutes as published in the newsletter were approved.

Treasurer Stan Sarch reported that the chapter's bank balance was in the black. Newsletter editor Mike Norton announced the deadline for articles for the July issue will be at midnight, Friday, June 5th. The folding party will be held Wednesday, July 10th at 5:30 PM at WKOW-TV.

Sustaining membership chair Fred Sperry submitted his report about the recent renewal of Token Creek Productions. The chapter continues with 23 sustaining members.

Frequency Coordinator Tom Smith reported about a July 1st deadline for licensees of certain broadcast auxiliary stations to submit information to the FCC. The Wireless Telecommunications Bureau is updating licensing information for Broadcast Auxiliary Radio Stations authorized under 47 CFR Part 74, Subparts D, E, F, and H to ensure the FCC database is accurate and includes the current Parent Station Call Sign Information. Licenses that are not associated with a broadcast station will be allowed to expire, starting July 1, 2002.

Gary Timm, Wisconsin statewide EAS Coordinator, was checking for frequencies for a statewide EAS network. FCC Chairman Michael Powell has formed a task force to review existing spectrum policies with public comments to be filed by July 8th, 2002.

Development continues on the Wisconsin Digital Television web site.

There was no old or new business. The meeting adjourned at 6:36 PM.

This month's program was a presentation by Doug Stacker and John Vransy of Weather Central.

## SPAM REMOVAL?

You may receive email solicitations with this paragraph included somewhere in the message: "This message is sent in compliance with the new email bill section 301. Under Bill S.1618 TITLE III passed by the 105th U.S. Congress this message cannot be considered Spam as long as we include the way to be removed, Paragraph (a)(c) of S.1618. Further transmissions to you by the sender of this email may be stopped at no cost to you by sending a request to be removed to \_\_\_"

This is not true.

U.S. Senate Bill 1618, an Anti-spamming (yes, *spamming*, not spamming) Amendments Act, contained a Section 301, relating to transmissions of unsolicited commercial electronic mail. S.1618 was approved by the U.S. Senate on May 12, 1998. It was then referred to the House Committee on Commerce on October 21, 1998. The Bill died in committee and was never passed into law by the 105th Congress, nor has the 106th Congress passed anything similar at this time.

So first, the quoted paragraph above is in error since the bill never became law. Secondly, if it did become law the SPAM messages generally received citing the above are deficient in compliance with the alleged law that they reference.

## AMATEUR RADIO NEWS

- The amateur radio satellite world is abuzz with news that the nearly three-decades-old OSCAR 7 satellite suddenly has come back to life. The bird was first heard June 21 by Pat Gowan, G3IOR—who copied and downloaded telemetry on 145.9738 MHz. AO-7 was launched November 15, 1974, and it remained operational for more than six years.

"I'm blown away," was the reaction of the original AO-7 Project Manager Jan King, W3GEY. King says that even "a cheap spacecraft built by a bunch of hams, without very many high reliability parts and without designing for a radiation dose like this, can last for 27+ years in space as far as a majority of its electronics is concerned." Following commissioning in 1974, AO-7 stopped transmitting in 1981 after a battery failure.

AMSAT, the non-profit Amateur Satellite Corporation, says it seems certain the satellite is running only off its solar panels, not from the onboard batteries, so it will only remain operational while it's in sunlight. King speculates that the batteries, which shorted as they failed two decades ago, now are "un-shorting" and causing the satellite to come back to life as long as it's in the sun.

- On May 2nd the FCC released a Notice of Proposed Rule Making (ET Docket 02-98) which, if approved, would give amateurs a new, secondary, domestic (US-only) HF allocation at 5.25 to 5.40 MHz and a new LF "sliver band" at 135.7 to 137.8 kHz. In addition, amateurs would be elevated from secondary status to primary at 2400 to 2402 MHz.

The FCC has recommended permitting amateurs to operate at full legal limit on a new 5-MHz allocation, but it left open for further discussion whether to restrict band access to certain license classes. The FCC also has invited further comment on whether the band should be broken down into mode-specific subbands.

On 136 kHz, the FCC has proposed limiting output to 1 W effective isotropic radiated power (EIRP)—or 100 W PEP maximum transmitter output—and with a transmission bandwidth of only 100 Hertz. The FCC proposed to limit access to the band to General and higher-class licensees.

## Dish (Echostar) – DirecTV Merger

When mergers take place that require government approval, documents are posted that give a rare view into an otherwise private world. The FCC has a trove of such documents on its web site concerning the DBS merger.

Dish Network has 6 million subscribers and DirecTV has 10.3 million. According to the financial pages, the ripe fruit has already been shaken from the tree. Signing up new subscribers for the merged system will be costly.

The primary sixty-one page document with all the signatures is a fine example of how lawyers can observe the formalities and still say nothing. There are many promises but they all lack specifics. The engineering exhibit is a bit more forthcoming.

The mega-headache is that the set top boxes for the two systems aren't compatible. Many of Echostar's birds have low power transponders. The high powered ones most used across the US are at 110 and 119 degrees WL. To get local programming from Dish Network requires an additional dish pointed at either 61.5 or 148 degrees WL. Fewer than 5% of their subscribers have installed a second receive dish.

DirecTV's customers are pointed at 101 degrees WL. A few have a dish that covers both 101 and 119 degrees WL. Even fewer customers are equipped to also receive 110 degrees WL. It appears that DirecTV has more useful transponders that are high power than does Echostar.

The two systems have a programming overlap of 300 channels.

Presumably those channels will be freed up for local into local or pay-per-view. It's not enough channels to accommodate all the potential local into local channels.

Both systems are launching spot beam birds that reuse the same frequencies in 5 to 7 ground footprints. That appears to be the preferred method for accomplishing local into local channels. I don't know what the energy budget is to maintain such precise coverage.

National programming will utilize transponders at one orbital location while local and regional programming will come from another. Thus the dual antenna will be the norm for the future.

Based upon my contact with over 6000 viewers back when satellite waivers were required, I found that the average viewer just wanted to get network programming and had no loyalty or interest in local television. It remains to be seen how many DBS customers will install the second dish.

The present capacity for SDTV channels is 500 for Dish and 460 for DirecTV assuming a 10:1 compression ratio. Post merger it is projected that the local stations in at least one metro market in each state will be carried. Up to 12 channels total will be reserved for HDTV. Both Echostar and DirecTV have offered Internet access but so far less than one percent of their subscribers have opted to use it.

Left out of the news headlines is the fact that DirecTV / Hughes owns 81% of PanAmSat and it will be part of the surviving company.

defined metro market can watch network programming is through his local network affiliate. "Local into local" makes the affiliate available in some local markets via DBS.

A person outside a major market who represents that he can't receive the local affiliate can be granted a waiver to receive a "national" feed of the network. Such feeds come from one of the major cities. Most prized on the west coast are eastern time zone network feeds that push the schedule up by 3 hours.

Many small market affiliates aren't available via local into local and thus must either grant waiver requests or fight a losing battle against their viewers. I believe the rather dubious legal protection provided for the local affiliates under the Satellite Home Viewing Act (SHIVA) as being a pen stroke away from vanishing.


Under the post merger plan, the viewers will require two dishes to get their networks (local affiliates) and national programming. Since viewers will rebel and write to their congressmen and DBS firms will most likely contribute to their reelection campaigns, I've already cut to the chase and written off local TV via DBS.

One of the major concerns for the future is: what happens when the public becomes aware of HDTV? I recall the time at NAB when I was in the HD exhibit area for over an hour and then had to go back to the main hall to meet someone in the Sony booth. The SDTV on the monitors looked awful. Should the public develop a taste for HD, neither cable nor DBS has anywhere near the capacity to carry more than a few HD channels.

broadcast areas and management; education credentials; desired market size; language skills and preferred location of employment. Each profile will be assigned an identification number that prospective employers will use to make requests, and members can use to monitor their posting. Cable pushes what they call digital cable. Digital cable is merely a way to compress from 8 to 12 SDTV signals into the space normally occupied by one uncompressed TV signal. If HD signals were in the 720P format, the most they could put in a one channel space would be two channels. For 1080i they can get only one channel of HD per channel.

As more bandwidth is required for HD, many of the marginal cable-only channels will disappear and there will be a major lobbying effort to permit cable systems to drop over-the-air channels that aren't significantly viewed.

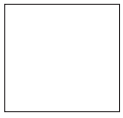

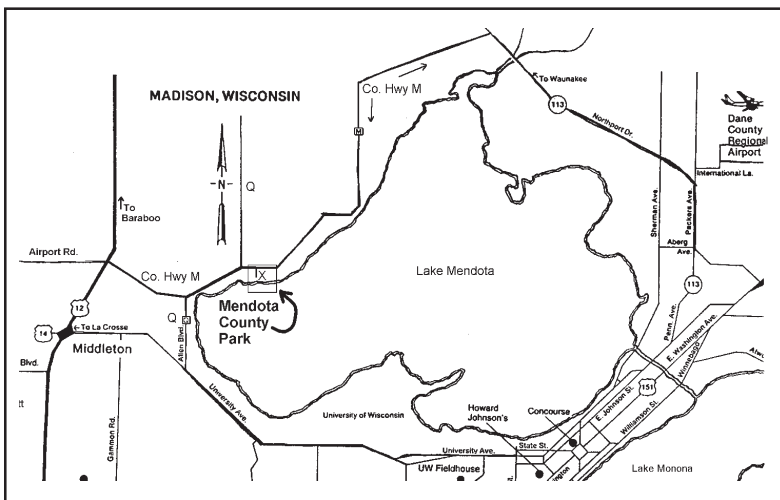
